

Session Class

- Create a subclass of WASession.
- Register your new subclass in the configuration interface as the *session class* to be used with your application.
- Access the current session instance from any component by sending self session (or by evaluating WACurrentSession value).

Application Dispatching



Session Examples

- Useful to keep an instance of the current user and its permissions.
- Useful to keep an open connection to the database you are using for persistence .
- Clean up the session state (e.g. close the database connection) by overriding #unregistered.

Error Handler

- Customize the error handling by subclassing WAErrorHandler:
 - Display a simple error dialog in the design of your application to the user.
 - Send an e-mail with the stack-trace and the debug link to the developer.
 - Allow the user to continue the session from the last page.

Renderer


- Use class-extension to add new tags or repetitive layout-constructs to WAHtmlRenderer.
- Override #rendererClass in your components to use a custom renderer of yours, e.g. a subclass of WAHtmlRenderer.

Apache

- >> Virtual-hosting
- Security and SSL
- Serve huge static files faster
- Hide long and ugly access-paths
- Map Seaside applications anywhere into an existing directory tree
